
City of Chicago Bud Billiken Day Parade The Bud Billiken Day Parade is a major Chicago community event, which reaches over a million people. A float was rented for the parade and an advertisement appeared in the Chicago Defender Newspaper. About 1.5 million people lining the streets of the South Side of Chicago saw the float. During and after the parade, an interactive experiment was performed in Washington Park as part of the "After-Parade Activities." Polymeric worms were made by squeezing sodium alginate into a salt solution. A poster about polymers was also presented. ACS chemistry day stickers were handed out and moles were given to those who ask or answered questions. Over 400 people attended the booth. The event was funded in part by an Innovative Grant. The parade organizers and the public were very grateful for our participation. Many parents personally thanked us for participating and hoped we would come back next year. The children really enjoyed themselves and learned some chemistry in the process. One child

asked: "Are we doing chemistry?" We said yes and he said it was a lot of fun. Several children came to the booth more than once. One of the volunteers for the event was an ACS Scholar. He was glad he participated and interacted very well with the children.
